



#### What is Going PRO?

A public awareness campaign in Michigan designed to elevate the perception of skilled trades and to showcase opportunities in a variety of rewarding career paths.

### What is the current situation for skilled trades?

- A sizable skilled trades shortage exists in Michigan and is expected to continue
- Approximately 15,000 new job openings are expected annually in Michigan through 2024
- \$51,000 is the median annual salary for skilled trades
- Opportunities exist in a variety of emerging industries like IT, healthcare and advanced manufacturing

### Who is the target audience for Going PRO?

- Young adults not committed to getting a college degree but interested in a career
  - o College isn't in their plans due to finances or lack of interest in four more years of school
  - o Demographically this segment is defined as:
    - High school juniors and seniors
    - Community college students
- Parents of young adults who are not committed to a 4-year college degree
  - o Parents are often a child's primary influencer their knowledge of the opportunities in today's skilled trades is essential

## What are the reasons to choose a career in skilled trades?

- A sizable and growing demand for skilled workers
- Fast-track career opportunities (12-18 months)
- Less school and debt than a four-year college program
- "Earn while you learn" completion of formal apprenticeship program while the individual is working
- Above-median wages \$51,000/year
- Opportunities in a variety of career paths that align with a variety of skill sets
